Transcript – Law vs Grace_There Is No Contradiction

Alrighty, Shabbat Shalom! And Shabbat Shalom to everybody who is watching with us today. I have a message today called, *Law versus Grace There is no Contradiction*.

And you know, I say this all the time and everybody feels the same way. We are living in such a deceptive world. You know, **Revelation 12:9** says, *Satan has deceived the whole world*. And we look at things like COVID and things with medicine. We look at things in politics and they are. I mean, whatever is right, it's called wrong. Whatever is wrong is called right. You know, and Yahweh even says in Isaiah, don't call life or darkness and darkness for life. And that's exactly what they're doing. But you know, on another end, it's only because of modern technology and fake news and the Internet that we understand this more. But this is nothing new, right?

And I want to talk about a situation today that has been going on for a long time with all of these falsehoods and; its law versus grace. And really, there is no contradiction. Every time you speak about bearing fruit for the kingdom, if you're talking to a Christian and it's *anything* about keeping the Sabbath or anything whatsoever, false Christians will always tell you, "I'm saved by grace and grace alone," right? They don't have to do nothing. They don't even have to breathe, right? They don't have to do anything.

As a matter of fact, what the belief in Christianity is that actually everybody is safe. They could be committing adultery. They can get divorced and remarried 20 different times. They can go out and kill people. It doesn't matter what they do because they're under grace. There is nothing they can do to lose their grace, you know, once they've always saved. The only people that are lost though, there are some people in their scenario that are lost, you know who's lost? I'm lost and you're lost. The only ones that are lost are people that are actually trying to change, people that are trying to bear fruit in their life and overcome sin and repent. Those are the only people they say are lost. Talk about how distorted, right? Talk about how evil, talk about how demonic.

It is, like I said, the same thing you see today with the COVID vaccine or anything else. It is the 100% complete opposite of what the truth is. So everybody that's doing evil and sinning is under grace. They are safe. But anybody that is trying to change and trying to do better and trying to obey Yahweh, they're lost, because they're trying to earn their salvation. So let's actually see what the Bible says because they're certainly not going to the Bible on this whatsoever. And it's a very easy thing to prove what's right from the Bible and what is wrong from the Bible.

So let's actually see. There is no contradiction between law and grace in Scripture. Hebrews 10 and verse 26. Hebrews 10 and verse 26. And this is a really good sermon to take good notes on and to go over with any Christian that you meet because some of them are just brainwashed and just want to live in their sinful lives and justify. But there are other ones that are just deceived because the pastors are actually teaching this, the false, the hirelings and, it needs to be exposed for what it really is. So Hebrews 10 and verse 26 says:

Hebrews 10:26 for if we are **willfully** sinning, ... right, willfully sinning, that means lying, stealing, committing adultery, whatever, that includes breaking the Sabbath. The Sabbath is one of the 10 commandments and also taking the name of Yahweh in vain ... If we are willfully sinning after receiving the full knowledge of truth, there remains no more sacrifice for sins.

Comment: So it is 100% absolute lie that, once saved, always saved. And once they, at the end of the bar stool, between drinks, they're accepting Yahshua in their heart that, they are saved forever. It is an **absolute 100% lie** and as we see here it's the total opposite. So if they are willfully sinning **after the full knowledge of the truth**, there remains no more sacrifice concerning sins. Yahshua's blood does not cover their sin.

Hebrews 10:27-31 But he is ready for the fearful judgment and zealous fire for being about to consume the adversaries. For if he, the one, ... the sinner, right ... if he who transgress the law of Moses died without mercies at the mouth of two or three witnesses, how much worse punishment do you think will be thought worthy to receive the one trampling the son of Yahweh? ... right? The one who claims he's under grace and is not changing, not repenting, living in sin ... How much worse punishment do you think will be thought worthy to receive the one trampling the Son of Yahweh? And having counted the blood of the covenant as common in which He was sanctified and having insulted the spirit of grace, ... right? So he's not, he's not making grace abound. He's insulting the spirit of grace by continuing in an awful evil rotten lifestyle. ... For we know Him who said vengeance belongs to Me, I will repay says Yahweh and again Yahweh will judge His people. It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living Elohim ... It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living Elohim.

So right here, one scripture, we could, close the book and say the sermon is over, that's the end of it, but there's a lot more to go over. But clearly there is absolutely **zero** biblical proof to show what they're saying, **nothing**, absolutely nothing there except taking a couple of scriptures that aren't even talking about the subject they're talking about and just twisting them as we're going to see here.

So before we start with law versus grace issue, let's first get down to the definitions, okay, of what we're looking at because Satan the Great counterfeit changes the meaning of the words to deceive the people. And if you look at today, this is exactly what they do in society, right? They take something as evil as murdering children, infanticide, right? The murdering of millions of children and they call it a woman's right to choose, right? So they call homosexuality, a vile disgusting sin, they call it a *lifestyle* choice. So they may think they're cute, at changing these meanings and they might think, but they're not kidding anybody and they certainly aren't kidding Yahweh. And the day is going to come where judgment is going to come, but **they are evil**, they're sinister and they're really, really demonic. It is absolutely evil what they do.

So let's first go over the definition so they can't be changed. So when you're talking with someone, **if you're talking about the subject, if their definition is not the Bible definition, you're not going to get anywhere**. You're just wasting your time. So let's go over here and let's see, right? So first, **the word** *law* **is the word** *Torah* and it actually does not even mean technically, it does not just mean law, it means partial law, but it doesn't, but it actually means instruction. So **Torah means instruction**, instruction for life, and it comes from the root, the Hebrew word of the word *mowreh*, which is teacher, right? That's why it's instruction. That's the way Hebrew works. Everything goes back to a two or three letter root word and then there could be 10 or 12 words from that root word that all have to do with the same thing, right? So it has to do with books, it has to do with law, it has to do with teaching, it has to do with instruction, it has to do with learning. It all comes from the same thing. So Torah literally means instruction; or instruction for life.

The word grace, what does grace mean? **Grace means unmerited pardon**, right? Being forgiven without deserving it, but never has any indication that it allows you to keep doing the sinful act that you're doing to begin with, but the opposite. It's actually as we're going to see the **exact opposite** that it literally **means grace** is **turning away** from that. So yes, it means unmerited pardon. So yes, you cannot pay the penalty for your own sins. Yes, it's only by Yahweh's grace and justification that you can enter His kingdom, but **nowhere**, nowhere in Scripture does it indicate you could just continue to sin.

And I always give the example, if you're driving down the highway and you're going 80 miles an hour in a 60 mile zone and the cop pulls you over, you broke the law, right? I don't know if you'd call the sin, but you broke the law. So you're under the penalty of that law and the cop though, he wants to show you grace, right? So he can't just say keep driving because that would not be justice. The law has been broken. There has to be a penalty pay, but you know what he does?

He says, even though it's going to be my whole day's pay, I am going to pay your ticket. I will pay your ticket. I'm going to show you grace. So now by him showing you grace and paying the penalty of your fine for speeding, did that give you a license to go back on the road and continue to speed? Of course not ... of course not. **The more** because the penalty was paid, because somebody *suffered*; the same as when Yahshua suffered and was humiliated and beaten and martyred for us, far be it from giving us a license to continue to sin. It gives us the responsibility to turn away from it. So the fact that our sins were forgiven, by that horrible death and crucifixion that Yahshua went through, by far not giving you a license to continue with the sin, but giving you avenue to get out of that sin, right?

And of course **repentance**. What does repentance mean? It actually is the word picture ... like I said, Hebrew started as a picture graph language before it was an alphabet language and the word picture literally means to **destroy the path to the house** ... destroy the path that got you there. Leave nothing to return to, right? And this is a major part of the conversion process, repenting. **It's a 180 degree turn**. So by definition, repentance is not doing the same thing you were doing before. It's doing the opposite of it. It's changing from there. And if there's no change in life, then what on earth? What on earth is the process of conversion all about anyway?

So I've had Christians tell me that by me saying that we have to *do* good works after conversion, after baptism, that we need to change our life and do good works, that that's degrading to their grace. And I tell them there is nothing more degrading to your grace than saying Yahshua's sacrifice meant nothing. You can continue to go and sin. You can continue to live in adultery. You can continue to lie and steal. And like we just read in Hebrews, it's the opposite. That is what's degrading to your grace, saying that it actually has no effect on your life whatsoever. So that is what's more degrading.

But again, **Satan is the counterfeiter**. Satan is the counterfeiter and we see it in the world today. We see in fake news, we see it that actually everything that is good is called evil. Everything that is evil is called good and Satan has deceived the whole world because people have a corrupt human nature. And you know what? Even though deep down they know a lot in that stuff isn't true, they could care less because anything that will allow them to stay in a sinful state and not change, they're going to want to do whether they really believe or not.

So let's go now to the book of Galatians. Let's go to Galatians 2 and verse 16 through 20. Because many times when you're looking at this whole issue of the Torah versus grace, right? The book of Galatians is the book with Romans, which we're going to go there too, is the two books that they try to go to that say, "oh, these books say that the Torah is done away with and how evil the Torah is and we're not supposed to follow it," which is nonsense, because you want to know something?

In the first century, the whole idea of keeping Torah, *not* keeping Torah was never an issue. It was never an issue not only with the Jews, it was never an issue with the Gentiles. It was never an issue whether the Word of Yahweh, because there was no New Testament. The New Testament didn't come ... the earliest it would have been was end of first century, more likely early second century, when actually the Brit Hadashah, the New Testament as a book, was there and we know it. So the apostles and the early believers from 30AD all the way up into at least 100, they only had the Tanakh. They only had the Torah and the Prophets and the Writings. They had nothing else. And for anyone to come and say that that was evil, that that was done away with it, that was meaningless, you would have been stoned to death by believers. They would have never ever accepted that because you know what you would have been doing? You would have been denying that Yahshua was the Messiah.

Because how did they prove Yahshua was the Messiah? It wasn't from a New Testament. There was no New Testament. It was from the 300 Messianic prophecies; the prophecies in the Torah, the prophecies in the Writings, the prophecies in the Psalms, the prophecies in the Prophets, in Isaiah. These were the Scriptures that they were going to, whether it was Jew or Gentile. It didn't make a difference, right? What happened when Paul met the Ethiopian, Eunuch, ... not Paul, I'm

sorry ... Philip, when he met the Eunuch in the book of Acts and what happened? You know, this is again, he's a non-Israelite and he's telling him *from the Prophets*, he's telling him, and from the Tanakh, how to prove Yahshua was the Messiah. So Galatians 2 and verse 16. He says:

Galatians 2:16a knowing that a man is not justified by works of the Levitical Law ...

Comment: And we prove this over and over, it's talking about the Levitical Law. We could prove it by the book of the Dead Sea Scrolls actually, that talks about the works of the Law as Levitical sacrifices. And if you look at the book of Galatians, this is what the issue was. It had nothing to do, whether you could lie and steal, or whether after you believe in Yahshua, you should be going out and committing adultery, to make your grace abound. It had to do with ... because the temple was still standing at that point, and it had to do with ... is grace alone sufficient for forgiveness of sins or did a believer still have to go to the temple and still have to do animal sacrifices? And that's what the works of the law was, not just the animal sacrifice, but with the animal sacrifice, there was also different acts of repentance that had to be done, like ceremonial law; you were unclean until the evening. And if you had to do this, you had to do that. So this is what it's talking about. This is the question that's coming up, which makes sense. As Yahweh's sanctuary, as the temple still standing there in Jerusalem, does a believer have to still go and do those, the sacrificial tasks of the first covenant; or is grace alone? So he says:

Galatians 2:16b-17 for knowing that a man is **not justified** by the Levitical sacrifices, ... the works of the law ... but that is through faith in Yahshua Messiah, we also believed into Messiah Yahshua, that we may be justified **by faith in Messiah** and not by works of the Levitical law, ... not by the animal sacrifices ... because all flesh will not be justified by works of law. But if seeking to be justified in Messiah, we ourselves also are found to be **sinner**. Is Messiah than a minister of sin? Elohim forbid! ... So right there again, even no matter what you believe these works of law are, it's clearly saying **you** cannot continue to go and sin.

Galatians 2:17b-20 Is Messiah than a minister of sin? Elohim forbid? For what if I build again these things which I have destroyed, I prove myself that I passed from the Commandment. For by the Torah I am dead and I might live to Elohim, I have been crucified with Messiah and I live, yet no longer I, but Messiah lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith toward the Son of Yahweh, the one loving me and giving His life on my behalf.

So very, very clearly this is what it's talking about and this is what it's saying, right? You are not saved by the killing of animal sacrifices that's under the Levitical order. We are saved by faith in Yahshua and faith in His sacrifice. Romans 3 and verse 21, that's the other book that they go to, to try to prove this which doesn't say it. You really have to twist Scripture. Romans 3 in verse 21:

Romans 3:21 but now a righteousness of Elohim has been revealed apart from the Torah being witnessed by the Torah and the Prophets.

So another thing that Paul is trying to prove when we are talking about the Torah itself, is why couldn't the Torah give eternal life, like the the apostle said? If a law was given to give eternal life it wouldn't be given because **the Torah can tell you right from wrong, but the Torah cannot change your heart**. Only by the Ruach H'Chodesh being imbued into a believer through baptism and the laying on of hands by a proper elder, can your life change. Only the Ruach can change, right? So that's the point of it that the Torah can tell you right from wrong but the Torah cannot change your heart.

Romans 3:21-26 But now a righteousness of Elohim has been revealed **apart from the Torah**, ... right? By the Ruach ... being witnessed by the Torah and the Prophets. Even the righteousness of Elohim through the faith of Yahshua Messiah toward everyone and upon all those believing for there is no difference. For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of Elohim ... Or the glory of Yahweh ... Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption in Messiah Yahshua, whom

Yahweh sent forth **as a sacrifice for atonement** through faith in His blood as a demonstration of His righteousness through the remission of sin that are passed in the forbearance of Elohim for a demonstration of His righteousness in the present time for His being just and justifying the one that is of the **faith of Yahshua** ... right?

So yes, nobody ever said you're earning your salvation. Of course you can't because **each of us have committed sins worthy of death** and the only way that those sins can be *paid* is somebody has to die. And that's why Yahshua had to die **to pay the penalty of our sins**. But as we'll see, I've been saying it along, I'm showing it, I'll show it 20 different times today. *After that*, after you get admitted into the kingdom, *after* your sins are forgiven, do you have a license to continue to go out and sin? No, **you do not**. So like he said:

Romans 3:25-26 whom Yahweh sent forth as a sacrifice of atonement through faith in His blood as a demonstration of His righteousness through the remission of our sins that are passed in the forbearance of Elohim, for a demonstration of His righteousness in the present time for His being just and justifying the one that is of the faith of Yahshua.

So where is the boasting? There is no boasting because **it is a free gift from Yahweh**. You're not doing good deeds to pay for your grace. No, you're doing good deeds because you were saved, because Yahshua is living in you, because that's *His way*, because that's His character and you're growing in the same character.

Romans 3:27-28a Where is the boasting? It was not there, through what law? Of works? No, through a law of faith. Then we conclude a man to be justified,

Comment: Right, set right before Yahweh. That's what justification means. We're going over definitions. Here's another one. **Justification means to be set right by Yahweh**, which can *only come* by His grace. You cannot justify yourself before Yahweh, right? But has nothing to do with doing good deeds afterward.

Romans 3:28-29 Then we conclude a man to be justified by faith without works of the law ... Without animal sacrifices. So you can be justified before Yahweh, without animal sacrifices. And again, the temple is standing at this time, so it's a perfect question to ask ... Or is He the Elohim of Jews only and not also of the nations? Yes, of the nation's only.

So it's also being asked in the nations because the nations were not going to the temple. They weren't allowed in there. They weren't even allowed to go up and do sacrifices. So that's another question that's coming up, right? If the Gentiles were not allowed to do the works of the law of the animal sacrifices, how could they be justified? The same way the Jews are justified by faith in Yahshua. It's not by animal sacrifices that you're justified and made right before Yahweh, because as we saw in **Hebrews 10**, **verse 1 through 4**, that **animal sacrifices cannot forgive sin**. The life of an animal is not equal with the life of a human ... *eye for eye, life for life*. So the animal sacrifice was *not to forgive* sin, but to *remind them* that they were sinners. So the works of the law, the animal sacrifices, could not forgive sin very, very clearly.

Romans 3:29-30 Or is He the Elohim of Jews only, and not also of the nation? Yes, of the nations. Since it is one Elohim who will justify circumcision by faith and uncircumcision through faith.

Comment: So very clearly again, circumcision is not the sign of the new covenant, it's the sign of the first covenant. **The sign of the new covenant is baptism** *by belief*, right? **And faith in Yahshua for the forgiveness of sins**, and it doesn't matter whether you are Israelite or of the nations, you're grafted in. So now he says, right? Now he's showing what it is in the New Testament. Very simple, right? Nothing here is ... but now does that nullify the Torah? Does that make sure whether you're a Gentile or a Jew as we just read? Does it nullify the Torah?

Romans 3:31 Do we nullify the Torah by faith? For be it on the contrary, we establish the Torah!

So right here, it talks about, *He's not the Elohim of the Jews only, but also the nations*. So we're talking about here, it doesn't matter whether you're Israelite or you're grafted in of a Gentile, does it nullify the Torah? And the answer is no! It not only doesn't it nullify it, **on the contrary, the opposite**, *it establishes it* because the Torah is Yahweh's character. And if Yahshua is living *in you* and you're freed now from the bondage of *your sin*, why would you go back under bondage of what you've already been freed for? As we're going to see here. John 5 and verse 14, John 5 and verse 14 coming from Yahshua's own mouth.

John 5:14 After these things, Yahshua found Him in the sanctuary and said to Him, Behold, you are a whole again ... So this is the person that Yahshua healed and then He finds Him in the sanctuary and He says, ... Behold your whole, **do not sin no more** less something that is worse than before should happen to you ... So **after healing** the man, right? And forgiving his sins, what does He say? ... You are whole now, your sins are forgiven, but do not go out and sin no more or less a worst thing will happen to you.

Go through the whole New Testament, go through Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, go through all the epistles, you will never find once anybody, particularly Yahshua, condoning sin or advocating sin or saying after their sin is forgiven, they're allowed to go out and continue and sin. The opposite He's saying here, go and sin no more or a worse thing is going to happen to you. John 8 and verse 34:

John 8:34 Yahshua answered, truly, truly I say to you, everyone practicing sin is a servant of sin.

You're the servant of what you obey, right? So you're either obeying Yahweh and His Torah, because His Torah, His Commandments is His character; don't lie, don't steal, don't commit adultery, don't bear false witness, right? Because sin starts in our mind, right? And we need that either have the mind of Yahweh, which is His Ruach and we're automatically thinking in righteousness and we would never do that; or we have the mind of Satan, right? The mind of our human nature and we're just trying to figure out by our own pride and our own selfishness and our own greed and covetness and lust how to get around anything for what's best for me.

So those are the two minds and you've got to go one or the other because you do have free will. And you do get to *choose* which Elohim you're going to follow; whether it's the true Elohim Yahweh; or it's the false one Satan. But very, very clearly, right? You're going to pay the consequences of it because you are the servant of what you obey. So if you're going to, after baptism, continue to live a lifestyle of sin, you're going to be the servant of that. 1st John 3 and verse 4, because what is sin? This is another thing that comes down to, right? **What is sin?** What does the New Testament tell us what sin is? Well, listen very clearly.

1st John **3:4** Everyone practicing sin practices lawlessness and sin is the breaking of the Torah ... Sin is the breaking of the Torah and the Torah are 1 John **3:4** ... sin is the breaking of the Torah.

So now if these false Christians are saying that there's no sin anymore, that Yahshua did away with sin, you could do whatever you want. Then if there's no sin, then why would we need His sacrifice? What would be the purpose of His sacrifice? He came to pay the penalty of sin. So if there's no more sin, what would be the purpose of His sacrifice? It's so utterly ridiculous, their argument. That like I said, usually sometimes arguments break down at the second level or the third level. This argument breaks down right away. It's a ridiculous argument that makes no sense whatsoever. And logically, you can't get past it unless people are just so brainwashed. Just like abortion. Trying to prove that abortion is a murder. I mean, how else can they say it? How on earth else can they say it? When that life, that fetus inside the mother is growing. And like I said, it's happened 60 billion times since Adam and Eve. And in every single case, every case, nine months later, a baby comes out. How on earth can anyone say it's not a life? So if you want to try to argue points one way or the other, but how on earth can you try to say it's not a life? Once it starts that way. It's an utterly ridiculous, evil,

demonic argument that it's not even worth it because people are just trying to get from nowhere. So sin is the breaking of the Torah. So clearly you cannot continue to break the Torah after you're forgiven. How hard is that to understand? It's very, very easy. Ezekiel 18 verse 20, look what it says:

Ezekiel 18:20 The soul that sins, ... and we just said what sin is, the breaking of the Torah ... the soul that sins, it will die. A son shall not bear the iniquity of the father and a father shall not bear the iniquity of the son. The righteousness of the righteous shall be upon him and the wickedness of the wicked will be upon him.

So each person will pay for their own sins. And that's what it says. Yahshua is going to come back and He will *judge* every human being that ever lived. And each one will stand before the judgment seat of Messiah and give account for what they did in the flesh, good or bad, everyone. It doesn't matter whether you're a believer or non-believer, an atheist, it doesn't matter what you were. It doesn't matter whether you laugh at it or whatever, every human being will stand. That's why there's going to be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Because when these evil people see the evil choice they made and then they're going to be pleading like anything, not because they're repentant, but because they don't want to perish at that point. But there won't be real repentance. So *the soul that sins it will die*. Before conversion, your works, your deeds only earn death as a sinner and it had to be paid for. And it was paid for - the blood of Yahshua.

Acts 2 and verse 38 ... Acts 2 and verse 38 and Peter said to him, this is the famous sermon that the Apostle Peter gave on the first Shavuot. It says that:

Acts 2:38 Peter said to him, repent and be baptized, repent, ... turn 180 degree turn. Destroy the path to the house where the sin came from. Leave nothing to go back for – repent ... repent, each of you in the name of Yahshua Yahweh, for the forgiveness of sins that you may receive the gift of the spirit of Holiness ... the Ruach H'Chodesh.

So that's what he's telling us - must repent and turn from the old way of life. Never is sin allowed to a New Covenant believer. No! You can't find any Scripture that says it. And like I said, even the argument when we're looking at Romans and when looking at Galatians is: with the temple still standing does a New Testament believer have to go to the temple to do animal sacrifices, the works of the law; or is faith in Yahshua enough? That is the argument. Not whether the Torah is still binding or not. Of course it is. Of course there was no other book that they had beside the Torah. And it was a Torah that proved, like I said 300 prophecies that proved Yahshua was the Messiah. Romans 6 and verse 23 ... Romans 6 and verse 23:

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death ... The wages, the wages, the repayment of sin. That is what you get for sin ... The wages of sin is death. But the gift of Yahweh is everlasting life in Yahshua Messiah our Master.

So that's the key to it. So all ... we all sinned like I read in Romans 3 - all have sinned and fall short of the glory of Yahweh. That's why we cannot be justified. We cannot be made right before Yahweh by our own deeds. Nobody is ever saying that. But once your sins are forgiven you have to have a change of life. And how do we know what right and wrong is? By the Torah, by Yahweh's Word. Yahweh is the One that tells us. It's not the society that's going to tell us that killing of babies is okay. That being a homosexual is okay. Being a transgressor is okay. All this other evil stuff that they say. That's not what it is. It's the Word of Yahweh. It's not people's heart. When people say, "well my heart tells me this or my heart tells me that," the heart is the deceitful above all things and desperately evil. You can't change the heart.

So this is where the only thing that is 100% righteous is the Word of Yahweh because His Torah, His law **is His character** ... it's His character. So you always do something. You're always doing some kind of work. It's just is the word good or is the work evil? So you will get wages for it. Good or bad, but the wages of sin is death. Romans 6, stay in Romans 6, go to verse 8 ... 8 through 13.

Romans 6:8-13 But if we died with Messiah, we believe we will also live with Him. Knowing that Messiah being raised from the dead dies no more ... Death no longer has dominion over Him. And that's what He promises us, right? That we will be, first fruits. We will be raised from the dead and made immortal at that point. If we continue in the faith, right? If we turn away from our sinful life ... For in Him He died. He died to sin once for all. But in that He lives, He lives to Elohim ... So we have to also die to sin. And what is sin? The breaking of the Torah ... So also you count yourself to be truly dead to sin, but alive to Elohim and Yahshua, Messiah our Master. Then do not let sin reign in your mortal bodies to obey it in its lust. Neither present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin. But present yourself to Elohim as one living from the dead and your members of instruments of righteousness to Elohim.

Very clearly that's what He says. We are to die to sin the same way that you should die for sin. And it's very, very clear. Must change your actions from sin to righteousness. And it can only come by the Ruach, by Yahweh's Spirit living in us. It's impossible to do this. He talks about this in Romans 8, the beginning of the chapter. It's impossible to do this from your corrupted human nature.

So **Messiah came to save us** *from* **our sins**, *not in* **our sins**. Very clearly to tell anybody that believes that they could just sit at the end of the bar stool, between the third and the fourth beer. They're going to go and say a little prayer and accept Jesus in their heart. Continue the sixth beer and then think their life has changed. And that they can continue sin and do whatever. And there's no accountability. It doesn't work that way. Yahweh is not mocked. Yahweh is not stupid.

And that's why didn't Yahweh just forgive sin? Why didn't He just say, don't worry about it? Why did Yahshua have to come and suffer a terrible death and suffer and be beaten and humiliated and die? You know why? Because **sin is a dirty business.** And Yahweh ... for someone who killed somebody's child, for someone who stole somebody's money, for somebody whose burned down somebody's house, for somebody who raped a woman, whatever they did. For Yahweh He said, "Ah, don't worry about it. Don't worry about it. You're under grace." That wouldn't be righteousness. That would not be righteous. There has to be a penalty paid for it.

So it's not just forgiven. There's a penalty paid. And Yahshua's life that is worth more than all of our lives together because He created every human being. That's why He had to come and suffer and die. Because sin is a dirty business. And it wouldn't have been righteousness to say, ah, forget about it. We'll just ... just don't worry about it. Forget about it. No, that's not grace. Grace is forgiveness on your end, but the penalty was paid on His end. That's what righteousness is. There has to be a penalty paid. And that's what the Torah tells us.

You know, you steal somebody's sheep, you have to give four sheep back. You have to ... it tells what the penalty is. And there's certain sins, like murder, idolatry, adultery, even Sabbath breaking. That it's the death penalty. You can't just murder someone and then, give them seven sheep and think that it's going to be okay. There's a death penalty that comes from that. So that is why Yahshua had to come and die for our sins. Romans 11 and verse 6 says:

Romans 11:6 but if by grace no longer it is of works, no longer of animal sacrifices; else grace no longer becomes grace. But if of works, it is no longer grace; else work is no longer work.

Right? So nobody is saying, and even forget the animal sacrifices anywhere ... nobody is saying that there's a deed you can do that can remove the sin from your life *except* by accepting the blood of Yahshua and His sacrifice. *His sacrifice* is the only sacrifice that can cover all sin. So, nobody is denying that.

And that is the whole acceptance when you get baptized. That *in faith* you're believing Yahshua's sacrifice is covering **and removing**, paying the penalty for it. Not just covering, but paying the penalty for *all* of your sins that were committed, whatever they were. But now you have to walk in newness of life. Do we continue to sin because grace abound? Yahweh

forbid! Yahweh forbid. Is the Torah done away with because of our grace? We establish the Torah. We establish it at that point.

So of course we can't earn salvation. Our works only got us the death penalty, right? Nobody had good works that can go up to Yahweh and say, "Hey, by my works, give me eternal life." No, all of our works only got us that death penalty and only His grace gives us the entrance for the kingdom. But where you will be in that kingdom, what your position will be. And He said, *In My Father's house is many rooms, many mansions*, right? There's many positions in the kingdom. Where your position will be has everything to do with your deeds. It has everything to do with the fruit you're bearing.

And you want to know something? If you're bearing no fruit, then you are mocking the spirit of grace and Yahweh isn't even going to bring you into His kingdom. We see that in the parable of the Talents. Very clearly, many, many parables that are there. That **you must bear fruit** from the gifts that Yahweh has given you. Jacob 2 and verse 14, because as we see right from the New Testament and Jacob, the half-brother of Yahshua, who actually was the leader of the Jerusalem congregation, and what does he say? Is there a contradiction between faith and deeds? No. So let's see here. Jacob 2 and verse 14:

Jacob 2:14-19 My brother's, what is the gain if anyone says he has faith but does not have deeds, ... right? He's full of hot air. That's all he is ... Is the faith able to restore him to life? But if a brother or a sister is naked and may be lacking in daily food, and anyone of you said, go and peace be warmed and filled but does not give them the things the body needs, what gain is it? So also faith, if it does not have deeds, is dead being by itself ... It's a false faith. It's not real ... But somebody will say, you have faith and I have deeds. Show me your faith apart from your deeds. And I will show you my faith by my deeds. You believe that Elohim is one (echad, united). You do well. Even the demons believe and shudder.

Jacob 2:20-23 But are you willing to know, O vain man, that faith apart from deeds is dead, was not our father Abraham justified by his deeds, offering up his son Isaac on the altar? You see how faith helped with his deeds and how by his deeds the faith was made perfect. And the Scripture was fulfilled saying in Abraham, believe Yahweh, and it was counted to him for righteousness and he was called friend of Elohim ... Why? Because again, it is impossible to please Yahweh without faith. And if you have faith, there will be a deed there has to be. That is the proof of it.

Jacob 2:23-26 And the Scripture was fulfilled saying, and Abraham believed Yahweh and was counted to him. And he was called for righteousness and he was called friend of Elohim. You see then, how a man by his deeds becomes righteous and not by faith only. But in the same way, Rahab, the innkeeper, was also justified by her deeds, having received the messengers and sending them out by another way. For as the body is dead apart from the spirit, so also faith without deeds is dead.

So people that have this argument, like I said, they're blowing hot air. It is a way to try to justify in their mind, in their warped minds, that they can have all the grace and all the blessings of the kingdom without doing anything. Without doing any sacrifice for Yahweh in their life. And that is nothing that we see in the New Testament. Absolutely whatsoever! 1 Corinthians 12 ... 1 Corinthians 12 and verse 4, and then I'll read verse 7 and verse 11. It says:

1 Corinthians 12:4, 11 And there are diversity gifts, but there is one spirit. And to each has been given the manifestation of the spirit, as a help to him. But the one, ... verse 11 ... in the same spirit works all these things, distributing separately to each as it wills.

So the Ruach is spiritual gifts to produce fruit for the kingdom. We *must use it*, or it will be taken away from us. Why else would Yahweh give us these spiritual gifts? They're not just for vanity sake. No! **They're to produce fruit for His kingdom.** It's to help us to change and for us to manifest ourselves to be His children, to become *like Him*. That's the whole point of it. And like I said, the Torah is not just a book of instruction, but is the character of Yahweh. Every single thing that's

written in the Torah is made by righteousness, which is Yahweh's character. In **Psalm 119:172**, *all Your commandments are righteousness*. Romans 5 and verse 8 through 10 ... Romans 5:8 through 10:

Romans 5:8-10 But Yahweh commends His love for us, and that we **yet being sinners**, Messiah died for us. Much more than being **justified now by His blood**, we shall be delivered from wrath through Him. For if while being enemies, we were reconciled to Yahweh through the death of His Son, much more being reconciled, we will be **saved by His life**.

We're forgiven by His death, but we're saved by His life. And now, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, life for life; Yahushua gave His life so that He can live His life in us. So He died on the cross, the only death sacrifice of the Melchizedek order, so that we can be a living sacrifice, Romans 12:1 and 2 to Him. That's the way it works. So if there is no fruit in your life, if there are no good deeds in your life, then how is Yahushua living in your life? Then we're saying that Yahushua's Spirit doesn't have any power in it. By receiving the Ruach, Yahushua lives in us. We must allow Him to do good works for the kingdom. And sin is still death ... sin is still death. Revelation 20 and verse 4 and verse 6, right? What is the reward when Yahushua comes?

Revelation 20:4 And I saw thrones and they sat on them and judgment was given to them and the souls of the ones having been beheaded because of the witness of Yahushua. And because of the Word of Yahweh, who had not worshipped the beast nor its image and have not received a mark on their forehead and their hand, and they lived and reigned with Messiah a thousand years.

So they didn't have an iPhone. They didn't have the QR code, but they did all these good things, right? And they were witnesses of Him and look at verse 6:

Revelation 20:6 Blessed and Holy is the one having part in the first resurrection. The second death has no authority over these, but they will be priests of Yahweh and His Messiah, and they will reign with Him a thousand years.

Blessed and Holy is them in the first resurrection, right. Works don't give you salvation, but it qualifies us for the position of rulership. We will be kings and priests under Yahshua, and the Bible tells us some will be over ten cities, some over five cities, some over two cities. How will that be decided? It will be decided by the fruit you're bearing now. Your reward is decided. Entrance into the kingdom? 100% by Yahweh's grace, by His mercy, right? Because we've only done things that have given us the death penalty. But once we are saved, once we have His Spirit, once He is living in us and we have eternal life in us, and we have our inheritance in His kingdom, right? Then from that point, yes, your deeds are where your reward will be in the kingdom. 100% absolutely! Matthew 16 and verse 27, He says:

Matthew 16:27 For it is necessary for the Son of Man to come in the glory of His Father, and then with His holy cherub's, **He will reward each man according to His work** ... He will reward each man according to His work.

That's why I say, Yom Teruah when Yahshua returns, it's technically not really the Feast of Trumpets, it's the Feast of Clamoring, the Feast of Noise, because yes, there will be trumpets blowing, and there are going to be people cheering and praising and screaming, right? Because they can't wait for Him to come because they have good works. And there will be people that were evil and only did evil things that will be screaming and gnashing of teeth because they're going to the lake of fire. So there's going to be a lot of noise on that day in both directions, but very, very clearly. And then He'll come with His holy cherub's, and he will reward each man according to his work. Revelation 22:10 through 12 ... Revelation 22:10 through 12:

Revelation 22:10-12 And He said to me, Do not seal the words of the prophecy of this book because the time is at hand, ... right? Revelation has been opened now. We're living Revelation. That's what He says. Don't seal the book any longer because we're living in it and it's happening. The time is at hand ... The one acting unjustly will continue to act unjustly,

and he who is filthy, will continue to be filthy, and to the righteous, let them continue to do righteousness. And he who is kadosh, he who is holy, let him continue to be kadosh. And behold, I am coming soon, and **My reward is with Me** to give each according to his work ... **My reward is with Me to give each according to his work**.

So like I said, entrance into the kingdom 100%, by Yahweh's justification and His grace, His mercy, but your *reward* has everything to do with what you're doing, with the fruit that you are bearing, absolutely 100%. Satan the great deceiver, is hoodwinking people to think they don't have to perform anything, right? So it's the same that he did in the Garden of Eden with Adam and Eve, right? What did he do? He tried to question them and twist Scripture. *Didn't Elohim say you could eat of every tree of the garden*, and then what did they say, "Well, no, not of the tree in the middle of the garden, we can't eat of it or even go near it or touch it less we die." And what do he say? "No. If you eat it, you will not die," right? He tried to tell them, no, sin doesn't bring death.

The same way that Christianity is telling you today, right? No, sin doesn't bring death. Matter of fact, the more you sin, you're going to be like Elohim, knowing good and evil. The same thing that the Christian pastors tell the people today, right? To keep sinning that grace abound. It is utterly evil that this is going on. So let's go to Luke 19 now, and let's see this again. Luke 19, starting verse 12 ... Luke 19 and verse 12, because this is an evil deception that Satan has, but when you look at the scripture, it is so clear. It is so clear that **we must produce fruit in our life**. Luke 19 and verse 12.

Luke 19:12-15 Then he said, a certain well-born man went to a distant country to receive a kingdom for himself and to return. And calling ten of his slaves, he gave to them ten minutes and said to them, Trade and keep busy until I come, ... right? These are the gifts of the Spirit He's given us ... And the citizens of his city hated him and sent ambassadors after him, and they were saying, we do not want this man to rule over us, ... the Jews ... And it happened as he returned, having received the kingdom, he even said to those servants to be called to him, ... those to whom he gave the silver, those who got the Ruach, right? And those who had the gifts of the spirit, ... that he might know what each **had gained** by trading, ... right? That we're supposed to be using the gifts to bear more fruit.

Luke 19:16-23 And the first came saying, master, your mina has gained ten minas. And he said to him, Well-done good slave, because you were faithful and the least thing, have authority over ten cities. And the second came, master, your mina has gained five minas. And he said also, have authority over five cities. And another came saying, master, behold, your mina which I have stored up in a face cloth. For I feared you, because you are a harsh man, taking what you did not lay down and reaping what you did not sow. And he said to him, I will judge you out of your own mouth wicked slave. You knew that I am a harsh man, taking what I did not lay down and reaping what I did not sow. And why did you not give my silver at the bank tables? And coming, I might have exacted it with interest.

Why? Why didn't they even do the least? Why didn't they do the minimal possible, right? But they didn't. So it's like these Christian people. Being obedient is one thing, not lying, not stealing. But that's not even bearing fruit. You have to go out and bear fruit. You have to use the spiritual gifts you have **to produce more** for the kingdom. But these people weren't even doing the minimal. They weren't even being obedient, right?

Luke 19:24-26 And those standing by said to him, take the mina from him, and those standing by he said, Take the mina from him and give it to him who has ten minas. And they said, Master, he has ten minas. And I say to you, for everyone who has it will be given. And from the one who does not have even what he has will be taken ... right?

So if you don't use the gifts of the Spirit, they will be taken away and given to somebody else. And the more you're using the gifts of the Spirit, the more that Yahweh is going to give you. Very, very, very, very clearly what on earth from that parable can't you understand, right? What can't they understand?

The Ruach is spiritual gifts to produce fruit for the kingdom, must produce deeds or it will be taken away. They got into the kingdom by grace. Where they will be positioned to serve, was by their deeds. We're not doing good deeds just for reward, but to be able to grow spiritually and better serve the people in the kingdom of Yahweh. And that's what I say when the kingdom comes ... you have millions of people in that kingdom ... I don't want to be way at the top. You know why? Because I don't have the ability to serve up there, but I don't want to be way at the bottom because I have more ability than there. I want to be where ever Yahweh has me, where I can serve at the perfect position. That's all I want ... that's all I want. John 15 ... John 15, a couple more scriptures and we'll be finished here. John 15, verse 1:

John 15:1-4 I am the vine. My father is the vine dresser. Every branch in Me not bearing fruit, He takes away and each one bearing fruit, He prunes so that he may bear more fruit ... That's what we do. You prune back your trees and then they bear more fruit in the future ... You are already pruned because the Word which I've spoken to you, ... right? What is that word? The word is His Word, the Bible ... Remain in Me and I in you. As the branch is not able to bear fruit of itself unless you remain in the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in Me ... and what did Yahshua do? Yahshua kept the Torah perfectly. Yahshua did not change the law or change the Torah or change anything from the Father. That's what He's saying. Do what He did? Follow His example.

John 15:5-10 I am the vine. You are the branches. Whoever abides in Me and I in him, this man will produce plentiful fruit because without Me you are not able to do anything. Unless one remains in Me, he is cast out as the branch and is dried up and they gather and throw them into the fire and they are burned ... That's the lake of fire ... If you remain in Me and My Word remain in you, whatever you desire, you will ask and it will happen to you. In this My Father is glorified. That you should bear much fruit and you will be My disciples. As the Father loved Me, I also loved you, continue in My love. If you keep My commandments, you will continue in My love as I have kept My Father's commandments and continue in His love.

So wow, it's very simple. Yahshua didn't start other commandments like they try to say. He kept his Father's Commandments. They are the same commandments. And they are the Commandments that are the same Commandments, including the Sabbath day. So very, very, very clearly, as like the parable, the sower and the seed we are required to have the deeds to bear fruit; or He will cut us away. Romans 2:12 and 13 ... Romans 2:12 and 13:

Romans 2:12-13 For as many as have sinned **without the Torah** will also perish without the Torah. And as many have sinned **within the Torah** will be judged through the Torah. For not the **hearers** of the Torah are righteous with Elohim, but the doers of the Torah will be justified.

Not the hearers, not just the people that hear. The people that are **doers**, the people that have deeds will be justified. Very clear. Very, very clear. Like I said, on the other end, pretty silent they don't have any scriptures. Only those couple in the beginning that they'll twist from Galatians or Romans, but there is no scripture, not even one scripture in your Bible, that tells you after conversion you can continue to live a lifestyle of sin.

Satan's big lie is there no requirement for change after conversion. And as I proved here today, that is absolutely false. So if you're the same person after conversion, what's the point of conversion, right? If no deeds are needed and no change of life is required, why would it believe you have to stay this earth after conversion? Why wouldn't Yahweh just immediately take them into His kingdom? What would be the purpose? The answer is: **Genesis 1:26** *We're made in His image, but we have to grow in His likeness.* Even the works, the deeds we do, are Yahweh's through His Spirit, not ours, right? So any good, any good deed that's coming, it's only His spirit that's doing it in us. We only allow His Spirit to work in us because we do have free will, so we have to allow that to happen. By freely surrendering our human corrupted nature to His spiritual one. If we have no deeds, then we really never repented and we never surrendered our human nature to His spiritual nature. Colossians 1 in verse 26 and 27:

Colossians 1:26-27 even the mystery having been hidden from the ages and from the generations, but now is revealed to His saints ... What is this mystery? ... To whom, Yahweh willed to make known what are the riches and the glory of this mystery among the nations, which is **Messiah in you, the hope of glory**.

And let me tell you something, if Yahshua is really living in somebody, believe me, **there will be a deed** because Yahshua is not dormant. There will be a deed, His Spirit is a Spirit of deeds, His Spirit is a spirit of goodness. The deeds that Yahweh allows us to perform are proof of Him living in us through His Ruach, His Spirit. If we have no righteous deeds, no change of life from before conversion, then we are not really under grace and we will perish.

So, the Torah, where first grace, there is no contradiction. And I pray that this ... because I know I am preaching to the choir in the Congregation, but I pray that a message like this, take notes that it will help you dealing with people in the world out there, the false Christians that have been deceived, that absolutely have been deceived into thinking that somehow, being a New Testament person that you are allowed to continue in sin. So, I pray this was a blessing. Yahweh bless, Shabbat Shalom.
